A MESSAGE FROM DAVE MALONE

Back in the late 1960's a Broadway Play, "Fiddler on the Roof," premiered and became one of the most successful shows on Broadway and around the world of all time. Looking back it's interesting to see what the appeal was and whether or not that appeal survives to this day. It does and in a big way. Teve, the



lead character, frustrated by the "newness" of everything sings a lead song, "Tradition" and captures the thoughts, not only of the present, but future. How important is tradition and how does it apply today and moreover how does it apply to music in the church?

In Christianity, we can see two basic forms of musical worship, traditional and "contemporary." Contemporary in quotes because no one has really definitely decided what that means. Thinking of traditional music, let's go to the pipe organ. For centuries now, especially in Europe, the organ has and still is the leading instrument of worship. Even very small churches will have a pipe organ and if not, a very good digital (rare in Europe) instrument. Guitars, drums, big speakers and thumping music is truly more American and thus labeled contemporary, and not heard very much in Europe.

In our church we have a magnificent organ. It is in need of partial restoration - replacement. Now, not the organ, but the controls. Remember the organ is up front, up top, in three chambers. The controls are in the big wooden console down below, unfortunately out of sight. On the control box (the console) are keys, stops, and pistons. The organ came with sixteen pistons, four work, barely, but they try.

Recently the organ underwent a major tuning, cleaning, restructuring of sound and is in remarkably better condition than it has been in quite some time. The console, however, must be updated with modern solid state controls. The keys remain the same, but the switching, which controls which stops play needs to be modernized. The wooden box stays since again is not seen.

When complete the organ will have 128 combinations, instead of sometimes working four. The cost for this type of modernization is not cheap, but not outrageous either. The organ retains its identity and is not presented with amplifiers or speakers, just the pipes. We have found a reputable organ builder, who if we went in to contract today, would not be able to begin for eight or nine months. We should have a detailed and exact estimate of this upgrade very soon. As Easter preparations are underway, we hope to have instruments join us once again for our celebration. We are blessed to have so many talented young people in our community and with the recent tuning, we will have beautiful music.

Please keep this in mind prayerfully and consider being a part of modernizing our instrument as this church is a traditional Methodist Church, worshiping in a traditional musical manner — for now. Let's keep the contemporary instruments for perhaps a revitalization of our early service, maybe, hopefully (?).





If you're looking for a cause that helps children, then this is the one for you. Sleep in Heavenly Peace is a ministry that gives children a safe and comfortable place to lay their heads at night and is for children living in our community.

The beds are delivered complete with a mattress and bedding. If you would like to donate new twin sheets (twin only not twin XL), twin comforters or thick quilts and shams (matching sets would be great) please drop them off in the narthex on Sundays or drop by the office during the week. The office is open Monday-Thursday 10 a.m - 3:00 p.m.

Monetary donations are also greatly appreciated. Please make your checks out to Sleep in Heavenly Peace and add FL-Lake City to the check notes to make it specific for our Lake City Chapter.

Since our bed delivery in December, we have continued to work in preparing ourselves for building and delivering beds. Finally on February 4th we had a successful bed build in the parking lot in front of Fellowship Hall. We had approximately 20 church volunteers and it was also supported by the SHP Florida Chapter Leader from Orlando, Bill Carelton. It was a fun experience and a good learning time for all. We currently haver 9 beds in inventory with cut/ sanded pieces for 4-5 more beds. We have received, on the SHP website, requests for 14 beds for our chapter in Lake City. They need to be contacted and interviewed but the word is getting out there!! We plan on another bed build in March, so stay ready and thank you for your support!!!

Church, you have consistently demonstrated your love for the Children's Home by your giving generously. Thank you!



CHRISTIAN SERVICE CENTER VISIT

A few of us visited the Christian Service Center in February to learn more about its mission and operation. We learned it was established by area churches 41 years ago. Jack King was one of the founding and long-term Board members. It gave area churches an organization they could trust to refer people to who needed help.

The Center does not just give handouts but helps people become self-sufficient. Applicants are screened and assisted with finding employment and educational or training opportunities. They are also encouraged to grow spiritually. Applicants are limited to 12 visits for help in total, with a limit of 6 in the first year. Applicants must provide proof they are residents of Columbia, Union, or Dixie counties. They are helped with gas to get to work, prescriptions, food, clothing, household articles and utilities. Providing these essentials helps applicants find and keep jobs or go to school.

The Center works with other agencies who can assist with housing, childcare, and other needs. They are governed by a 14-person directive Board comprised of ministers and businesspeople. They provide food for those in need which would otherwise be discarded. They are an asset to our community and after our visit I feel confident that donations to them are well spent. The Director and Assistant Director are full-time employees. One part-time employee manages the huge warehouse. All other work is done by volunteers. It is only with God's help and some very dedicated volunteers that they can

accomplish so much. In 2021 they managed 2,000 cases. A case represents one person or a family so the number of people served is amazing. They gave away food and other assistance worth about \$300,000.00. They had 40 volunteers before the pandemic, but now are down to 16.




