



He was miming to the music, not actually playing the organ. Some might think this was supposed to be funny, however if looked at carefully, another more concerning message appears. Many churches continue with services offering "canned" music. Parishioners simply listen to recorded


music and consider that participation. Gone might be the days when church-goers actually participate in music during worship. This is a trend that we see mostly in contemporary churches, which appear to be more like rock concerts than worship. The argument is that it doesn't really matter as long as it is all about God. Truth is, though, that it does matter!

Consider this: "As hymnals fade, theology also suffers. The rich repository of religious wisdom contained in hymns will be lost. The old-fashioned language of hymns may strike some as unusual, but their text teaches the Christian faith far better than most of the praise choruses that dominate contemporary services. Old hymns were carefully crafted with theology at the forefront. Traditional hymns present doctrine clearly and beautifully convey the gospel story of saving grace."

Since our next 5th Sunday is Easter, we're moving Hallelujah sing up to the 4th Sunday- **PALM SUNDAY- March 24**.





SLEEP IN HEAVENLY PEACE

If you're looking for a cause that helps children, then this is the one for you. Sleep in Heavenly Peace is a ministry that gives children a safe and comfortable place to lay their heads at night and is for children living in our community.

The beds are delivered complete with a mattress and bedding. If you would like to donate new twin sheets (twin only not twin XL), twin comforters or thick quilts and shams (matching sets would be great) please drop them off in the narthex on Sundays or drop by the office during the week. The office is open Monday-Thursday 10 a.m - 3:00 p.m.

Monetary donations are also greatly appreciated. Please make your checks out to Sleep in Heavenly Peace and add FL-Lake City to the check notes to make it specific for our Lake City Chapter. Checks can be dropped off at our church office or donated on-line at shpbed.org.

Well, 2023 was a great introductory year for our chapter. We met our goal of building 100 beds. Our chapter name is getting out into the community, and we have had a large influx of new applications.

We had a very successful bed build on February 3rd and we built 33 beds with 55 volunteers to support us!!! Thank you! Each Bed Build seems to teach us new improvements and the build teams work great together in getting the beds built. Our latest build we started around 8:45am and we built 33 beds in just over 3 hours. We had folks come from several churches, along with the Rotary, and Shriners Clubs, and a family whom we had delivered some beds to.

We were invited to provide presentations about Sleep in Heavenly Peace to several groups including the Shriners Club and Lady of the Lake Quilt Guild. It was a good time and was well received. The Shriners committed to helping us in Bed Builds and The Lady of the Lake Quilt Guild has donated 37 handmade quilts this past year. Thank you to both!!!!

We continue to make bed deliveries. We have set up into 4 delivery teams to help expedite deliveries and it seems to have improved our delivery rate. We have a sizeable backlog of beds to be delivered. We are averaging 4 to 6 beds per week.

As of 2/18 we have built 135 beds, delivered 81 beds and have deliveries of 71 beds in process. We always have a need for more volunteers. We can use help with Media Support, helping to obtain Sponsorship and donations.

Thank you for your continued support. We look forward to an even greater year of helping our kids!!

THE FLOWER CROSS

OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD SHOE BOXES FOR KIDS

Shoe boxes for kids are collected in mid November as an outreach by local churches and communities in conjunction with Samaritan's Purse. It allows Christians to share God's Love with children around the world and was started by Franklin Graham. Individuals may pack boxes but groups may also find that collecting items throughout the year makes more sense as people find great sales at times making it possible to "purchase" in bulk and stretch dollars!! Items are collected for boys and girls ages 2 to 14 years of age. Items that may not be included are: candy, gum, toothpaste, foods, liquids or lotions, aerosol cans, glass or breakable items, seeds, scary or war related items, medications or pills, and any damaged items.

First Methodist Church of Lake City is collecting items to pack for children through October 2024. If you wish to help with collecting items for these shoe boxes, here is a list of ideas for purchase. We will also have month to month ideas listed in the Sunday bulletin.

"Wow" items -soccer ball with pump, doll, stuffed animal, shoes, jacks, yo-yos

Toys-toy cars, jump ropes, yo-yos, light up toys with extra batteries.

Personal Care Items-tooth brushes, washcloths, combs, hair brushes, tooth brush holders, soap & soap box

School Supplies-pens, pencils, sharpeners, crayons, markers, notebooks and paper, coloring and picture books, solar calculators, rulers, scotch tape and number flash cards.

Accessories-socks, sunglasses, jewelry and watches, flashlights with extra batteries, hair ties or barrettes.

Any of these items may be purchased at anytime of the year and brought into the church office Monday-Thursday from 10 am— 3 pm or dropped off at the table in the narthex on Sundays. Monetary donations are also appreciated to help with the cost of shipping.
